Governing Urban Infrastructures Under Pandemic Conditions: Some Thoughts

Urban infrastructure has appeared as a central feature in a range of commentaries on the COVID-19 pandemic. Understanding the imprint of the pandemic on cities and their rebuilding through power-laden processes requires an attention to the politics and governance of infrastructure. In this intervention, we understand the pandemic as a moment to rethink claims over the studying of how infrastructures work. We focus on three dimensions where COVID-19 has underscored the importance of infrastructure governance: as pandemic condition, as pandemic vulnerability, and as pandemic response. We argue for the attunement of a strand of future academic work to the continued importance of the governance of and by urban infrastructures in a world of cities in which COVID-19 and its associated economic, environmental and social implications are likely to remain pervasive.
