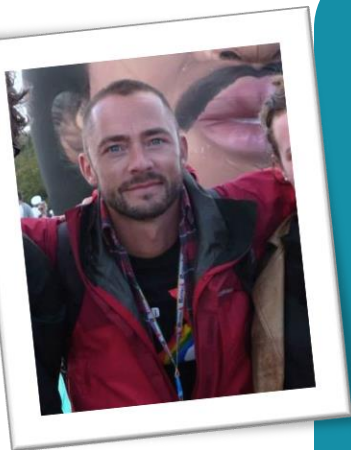

This talk will draw on a series of reviews that I co-wrote on these matters, an on-going programme of conference sessions on the challenges of doing effective qualitative research, and my own experience to reflect on the positives and pitfalls of how we do and describe qualitative human geography research today. I particularly want to consider what we say to one another about our methods, how we tend to draw on evidence to make arguments in our published papers, and what this all says about our imagined audiences.
