The Emergence of a Build to Rent Model: The Role of Narratives

ABSTRACT

This paper analyses 'Build to Rent' (BTR), a new form of tenure in London's housing market. We examine the ways in which private and public sector actors have shaped the context of its emergence, and developed a model for delivery in London. We argue this relies on the construction of narratives of negativity about the private rental sector which BTR actors juxtapose with their product, to position BTR as a solution to part of London's housing crisis. Building on this, and leveraging an emerging but supportive institutional context, real estate professionals have adapted a US model to the UK. We argue that both the narrative generating activities and the model development reveal tensions, best analysed through a focus on the temporalities of investor preferences.
