Social Identity and Class Consciousness among Hong Kong Farmers

ABSTRACT

Given the social and political significance of 'the peasant' (nongmin) in modern Chinese history, it is surprising that the term nongmin is largely absent in Hong Kong, where discourses about individual farmers (nongfu) are far more prevalent. In tracing the modern etymology of Chinese peasants and the history of Hong Kong agriculture, this talk argues that the lack of 'class' consciousness makes Hong Kong farmers even more vulnerable to the unceasing wave of urban sprawl.

Loretta Lou is a Lecturer in Sociology at the University of Macau and a Visiting Fellow in Anthropology at the London School of Economics.
