





Geography



- The island of Murano is situated 1.2 kilometers north of the city of Venice
- The island's 1134
 acres are divided into several islands



Characteristics


- Artistic
- Family-run, small sized companies
- The secrets of glassmaking were originally passed down from father to son, from generation to generation.
- Energy-intensive
- Glass museum



History

- 7th Century: a commercial port
- 10th Century : a prosperous trading center
- 1291:the Venetian Republic ordered glassmakers to move their foundries to Murano
- late 14th Century: the daughters of glassmakers were allowed to marry into Venice's blue-blooded families
- Special because they invented how to make glass mirrors
- still important exporter of traditional products like mirrors and glassware





A story of glassmaker.....




- 1291 the Venetian Republic ordered the glassmakers to move to murano to avoid the fire as the house at that time are made of wooden
- the glassmakers weren't allowed to leave the Republic and if they got caught, they would be assassinated or have their hands cut off

by the secret police

Population



- Over the past 40 years, the island of Murano has seen a gradual decrease in the number of people employed in glass making
- Due to the closure of many companies or to their decision to move to the mainland



Economy

- dependent on the glassmaking trade for the majority of its income
- the sale of the glass products to visitors
- Tourism
- Even museums established to educate tourists about glassmaking

Burano

- "The island of light, the harmoniously quiet island, forgotten from the land, voted to the religion of the sea".
 Michel Desforgues
- a small island in the northern reaches of the Venetian lagoon
- Population: 5,000
- out-migration and a declining birthrate

Characteristics



- the facades of the houses in different color
- Fish-village
- Lace making
- Lace Museum



History





- Since late 14th century :
 - the impulse for the expansion had been given to this traditional type of needlework by Duchess Morosina Morosini, Doge Morosini's wife
 - She establish a workshop employing 130 lace-makers
- 16th century :
 - rising in importance when women on the island began making lace with needles
- 17th century:
 - Louis XIV of France was said to wear an original and very precious lace collar made by the Burano lacemakers in two years of patient needlework
 - lace exported across Europe
- 18th century :
 - decline



Story of lace making....



- 1871 lace making school open
- 1970 lace making school close down
- 1981 lace making school converted to lace museum
- 1995 recognized as Venesian civic museums




Economy



Century-old glass making techniques

- Early 16th century: colourless---->colourful
- e.g.+copper or cobalt compounds to make blue glass
- crystalline glass,
- glass with threads of gold,
- multicolored glass,
- milk glass etc.



Metals	Colour they generate
Cerium	Yellow
Uranium	Yellow
Chromium	Green
Iron	Green
Cobalt	Blue
Copper	Blue
Gold	Red
Lead	White
Manganese	Purple
Nickel	Purple


 Decline of both resident population and employees in glass making industry

Threats

- Pollution in Murano
- The processes used to make glass produce pollution









- furnaces used by the manufacturers in the melting and coloring of glass release many toxic emissions
- Most furnaces do not utilize chimneys
- No chimneys, no membrane filters installed






Noise pollution

- created by the mechanical processes e.g. grinding and cutting
- Heavy machines e.g. grinders, chimneys, saws









Water Pollution

- liquid waste
- contains many of the heavy metals used to color the glass
- Lack of filtering system
- untreated water is then released directly into the lagoon








What is lace?

- Needle lace
- Bobbin lace













Lace museum (former "school")

In the foreground: Lace Museum.

In the ground floor: "Spazio del Merletto" Lace School.

- Needle lace: rarer than bobbin lace
- Local product / craft in Venice









Burano - Weaknesses

- Population change
- Lack of promotion
- Labour intensive → Time consuming
- Lossing uniqueness: Lace making are common in other countries, too

(e.g. England, Dutch, Belgium)















Burano - Threats

- Population change
- Loss of technique, heritage and culture
- Lack of promotion to tourist
- Made in China?
 - Several tourist guide book recommend: Be careful on buying lace, as many of them are made else where (e.g. made in China)













- **BURANO**
- LACE MUSEUM
- The museum was founded in 1981 and it's located in the seat of the Old Lace-School of Burano, born in 1872 on Adriana Marcello's initiative to re-launch the secular tradition of the lace production.
- The museum exposes more than one hundred different needle-laces together with very interesting historic documentations about its way of production, dating back to the XVI and XX centuries.

 The museum offers also the pleasant opportunity to watch women (lace workers) produce beautiful laces (only in the morning).
